He who will not respond to its accents, and strain every nerve to carry into effect its provisions, is unworthy of the name of free man...of my own part, of property, I have some, of reputation, more. That is staked, that property on the issue of the contest: and although my grey hairs may descend to the sepulcher, I would infinitely rather they descend there by the hand of the executioner than desert this sacred cause of my country."

It is men like this who made America free and a nation which God could bless. May God grant us many men of this caliber today in places of leadership and authority in all realms of government.


